Academic calendar	First semester: mid-September to End of January Second semester: February to mid-May
Language requirements	Minimum of French B1 for engineering and master courses in French; minimum of English B2 for spring semester.
French language courses	The INP organizes a 4-week intensive French course for incoming international students before the beginning of the university year. <u>https://www.enseeiht.fr/fr/international/coming-to-enseeiht.html</u> It includes 20 hours of French lessons per week, a preparation for engineering school studies but also cultural activities and guided tours (1 per week).
	French lessons are also proposed in each semester (3h per week) and credited (2ECTS). There are no tuition fees for exchange students.
Grading system	Our grading system is a 20-point scale. A minimum score of 10 is required to validate an Academic Unit (UE). 10 = average (≃ GPA of 2) 12 = good (≃ GPA of 3) 14 = very good (≃ GPA of 3.7) ≥16 = excellent (≃ GPA of 4.33)








APPLICATION FOR AN EXCHANGE

Application procedure	All candidates must be nominated by the international office of their home University and nominations will be addressed to the ENSAT International Office (international.ensat@toulouse-inp.fr)
	Nominated candidates will receive a link to submit their e-application on the online application mobility platform.
	 Download, fill and send the learning studies form making sure that the name of the specialization or Master course is mentioned as well as the list of course modules that will be followed. Upload all the documents required on the e-application mobility platform as listed in: <u>http://www.ensat.fr/en/international/incoming-exchange-students.html</u>
Deadlines	June 1 st : for 1 st semester (fall semester) or full academic year
	November 1 st : for 2 nd semester (spring semester)
Study requirements for incoming students	The learning agreement must contain at least 20 ECTS per semester and in the same engineering or Master course . Students will need to have proven records in the prerequisites to follow the courses they wish to enroll in.

Health insurance	A health insurance coverage is compulsory to study in France
	For European students: you need to request a Health Insurance European Card before your departure
	For non-European students : you will have to register for the social security (free for all students) on AMELI website (CPAM): https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/ once your registration at ENSAT is completed.
	If you plan to arrive to France a few days before the beginning of the academic year, you will need a private health insurance to cover your stay in France before your registration at Ensat.
	For all students: a complementary health insurance (about126€/year) is highly recommended to be reimbursed for your health care expenses at the best rate.
Other insurances	Civil liability insurance (compulsory) $\simeq 15 \epsilon$ / year, payment on registration
	Insurance for the accommodation (compulsory) $\simeq 25 \epsilon$ /year
Visa	EU students: No visa required
